MINISTRY MISSION

To servant-lead and equip others to become passionate followers of Christ who are compelled to reach a dead and disillusioned world with the Gospel of Jesus Christ

I believe that true ministry is grounded on two Scriptural principles: the Great Commandment and the Great Commission. The Great Commandment—"You shall love the Lord your God..."— provides the motivation for the Great Commission—"Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations..." The Church's primary mission is to love God and serve Him— through evangelism, discipleship, and life-long worship. By God's grace and guidance, I will seek to lovingly lead God's people to become passionate followers of Christ, fully equipped and devoted to reaching the world with the Gospel. The primary means of fulfilling this calling God has placed on my life will be an intentional focus on shepherding the flock of God through a ministry of prayer and the Word.

PHILOSOPHY OF MINISTRY

The Motive: I believe the overriding motive for everything God's people do is worship (Rev 5). God is to be worshipped because He is infinitely glorious and infinitely worthy. This is good news because humanity finds the very purpose for which it was created in worship. When God's people encounter the grace of God, they are compelled to respond in worship. Worship, therefore, does not arise out of a sense of duty, but delight.

The Members: I believe that the work of the ministry is to be done by Christ's Body—the people of God (Eph 4). Each individual believer has been gifted by the Spirit of God to accomplish the work of the ministry. Although the gifts of the Spirit vary, all are necessary and work in conjunction with one another to accomplish a common goal: "the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ until we all attain the unity of the faith..." (Eph 4:12-13). Ministry, therefore, is not to be reserved for "credentialed professionals" or a select few, but shared with God's people.

The Means: I believe the Mission of the church—The Great Commission—can only be accomplished by God's empowering presence (Acts 1:7-8). Without the powerful presence of the Holy Spirit, ministry is an impossible task. No teaching or preaching, no matter how powerful or persuasive, can change one life or make one disciple apart from the province of the Spirit of God.

The Minister: I believe that the primary responsibility of every pastor-teacher is to lead the body of Christ into becoming fully functioning, reproducing followers of the Lord Jesus Christ (Eph 4). The pastor's leadership begins in the pulpit, as he shows himself to be a faithful servant who accurately handles the Word of God (2 Tim 2). However, the minister must also love and care for his flock, as effective ministry can only be accomplished through relationships.

The Message: I believe that the means may change, but the message never changes. The pastor must preach one message with two aspects. First, the pastor must "preach the Word" (2 Tim 4:2) to equip the saints for the work of ministry. Secondly, the pastor must faithfully and courageously preach the good news of Christ's death, burial and resurrection (1 Cor 15; 2 Tim 4:5). The first is designed to equip the saints. The latter to reach the sinner. Both have one purpose: to multiply worshippers to the Triune God.
